HOW TO REGISTER:

Online (the quickest option!):

Step 1: Each student 16 and older will receive an email to their DPS email account, including a unique one-time code. Note: do not share this unique code with others.

Step 2: Click the link to login into MyChart. If you do not have a MyChart account, you will need to create one. Please use your DPS student email to create your MyChart account. Once in MyChart you will be able to schedule your vaccine appointment.

By Phone:

If you don't have access to MyChart, you can schedule an appointment by calling **303-602-8958**. Please listen to all options. Phone wait times may be long, but we want to help get your vaccine appointment scheduled as soon as possible. You can also call your local SBHC to schedule your vaccine appointment.

REMEMBER: If you are 16 or 17, you need to get parental consent to get vaccinated. Please make sure your parent fills out a consent form and you bring it with you to the vaccine appointment. Click [here](#) to download the consent for treatment form.

- People may have some side effects after the vaccine. These are normal signs that your body is building protection and only lasts a few days.
