Information about AAPHC

- Corporation initially established in 1978 and current institution was incorporated in 1979.
- Grant for FQHC Grant to develop clinic in Lee County was based on thesis project regarding lack of care for women and babies in the community, particularly prenatal care. AAPHC did not implement OB services until 2009...thirty years later.
- AAPHC had three locations in 1982 and has grown to include 33, which includes 10 school-based sites.
- AAPHC opened the doors to it's inaugural School-Based Health Center in March 2013.

Turner Elementary SBHC (inaugural site)

- Approximately 500 students
- Approximately 50 Faculty & Staff
- Grades K-5
- 99% free and reduced lunch
- Over 90% African American
- Less than 5% utilize English as a Second Language



School System Buy-In and Support

- Meeting with the Principal and Assistant Principal monthly
- Meeting with the District Wellness

Summer Behavioral Health Program

Our SBHC's host a summer pediatric behavioral health program to continue continuity of care for students that really need the services throughout the summer. Two sessions are held during the summer to allow students in summer school to attend the program as well. The SBHC coordinates with the school system for transportation services, lunch for the students, and the use of the school social workers.



District Wellness Committee

- Clinic Director for the School Based Health Center Co-Chaired the District Wellness Committee alongside the Director of Nutrition Services
- A lot of stakeholders engaged by the SBHC that serves on the committee
- The District Wellness Committee has made policy changes regarding healthy eating and social and emotional health

Food Insecurities Program

- Collaboration with a Local Farmer and a Program called Flint River Fresh
- Screen students during wellness visits for food insecurities
- Fresh produce taken to families on a weekly basis
- Developed Community Gardens with the help of faculty/staff, parents, students and employees of the SBHC



SBHA DASH Grant Program

- Developed a Youth Advisory Council of middle and high school students
- Discussed how to get information out to the students on STD awareness and testing
- Held an STD testing event during STD Awareness month
- Held a Youth Summit event to promote STD awareness






Official Testing Days

- Provided Gonorrhea and Chlamydia and HIV testing on April 24, 2018 and April 26, 2018
- **Testing performed by:**
 - SBHC Nurses
 - Laboratory Manager (FQHC)
 - RN (FQHC)
- Total Number Tested 79 GC/Chlamydia 8 positive for Chlamydia
- Total of 47 HIV OraQuick Tests One Positive, but confirmatory was negative







The Terrell County School-Based Health Center will be conducting voluntary & confidential STD (chlamydia and gonorrhea) & HIV testing for students of Terrell County High School. All 9th – 12th graders can be tested confidentially (GA CODE § ANN. 31-17A-2). Testing will be conducted on a completely voluntary basis and will be strictly confidential. Treatment services will be available by referral or through the SBHC.

It is our hope to bring awareness and education to this vulnerable population.

Flu School Vaccine Campaigns

- Held a school wide flu vaccine campaign at the school sites where we have SBHC's
- Sent letters and a consent form home to the parents to inform them about the flu vaccine campaign
- First Year doing this programthe school where the program was held had the least amount of flu cases out of all the schools within the school system
- Also used this opportunity to increase the number of students using the SBHC which helps with sustainability




